

Age Division Rules

1. The age determination date is August 1, 2020. For example, a player in the 12U division cannot turn 13 before 8/1/2020.
2. Unsigned seniors with remaining high school eligibility can play, but they cannot turn 19 before 8/1/2020.
3. Unsigned seniors can play as long as they have not committed in writing to play for a college at any level. If a player has signed a letter of intent and you think they will not qualify because of grades, they still cannot play. The Tournament Director has the right to exclude any senior from playing. No player who has attended junior college or university may play in this event.
4. Bring proof of age for all of your players with you to the tournament in the event a team challenges a player's age.
5. Challenges are \$50 per player. Challenges can be made before or after the game in question. The \$50 is refunded if a challenge reveals a team has an ineligible player participating.
6. A player can participate in a maximum of two divisions and two teams per tournament as long as they meet the age requirements for both divisions.
7. Players cannot play on two teams in the same age division.
8. Players participating in bracket play must have participated in at least one of the team's pool games.
9. If any team or player violates any of the rules above, the pool games where the rules were violated will be deemed as a 15-0 loss. If the rules above are violated during bracket play, the team will be eliminated from the tournament.
10. Any player who is associated with violating any of the rules above are disqualified from the tournament.
11. If a player's age is challenged and they do not have proper documentation to prove their correct age, they will be disqualified from the tournament and the team penalized.
12. If a team forfeits the tournament for breaking the rules above during pool or bracket play, the Tournament Director will decide the progression of another team.
